

- Challenges even motivated students








### Who Should Take Honors Courses?

- There are 24 hours in a day:
  - Evaluate how much time will be spent in other activities such as athletics, fine arts, church, and outside of school activities (don't forget family time!)
- Review the Honors vs. Level expectations checklist!

# Honors vs. Level

#### IMPORTANT INFO REGARDING Level vs. Honors CLASSES

Students in the T<sup>th</sup> grade wanting to take Algebra are required to take the University of Texas Credit By Exam and score a minimum of an 80 or attend summer school for pre-algebra initial credit. Students must make at least an 80 in the summer school class. Students should have upper level problem solving aptitude and mathematical reasoning.



  - All other sports- sign up for PE











### **District Schedule Change Policy**

Principals select and hire teachers and create the master schedule based on the student course requests. Because these selections determine the schedule, student schedule changes will be made if a placement mistake has been made. Students receive a verification of the courses that they have selected in the spring. At that time, they will have the opportunity to change selections. Changes after this time will be done only if students have not taken the required prerequisites for a course or who have been misplaced in a course. In the event of a student being placed in the wrong course, he/she must continue to attend the scheduled class until the counselor makes the schedule correction. When a semester begins, administrative changes sometimes occur due to an imbalance of numbers in classes. Students should choose electives and alternates carefully. Those decisions are binding. Each campus sets the deadlines for submitting course changes.

- Make <u>any</u> needed changes to course verifications by **April 12!**

After this date, schedule changes will occur **ONLY** if there has been a placement mistake!

## Some Important Things to Remember...

- □ Complete Course Request sheet & turn in to your teacher by Friday, March 1st
- Be sure to rank elective choices in order of preference from 1 (MOST preferred) to 5 (least preferred)
- Parent AND student signature should be on the
   Course Request sheet (yellow paper)
- Make <u>any</u> needed changes to the verification sheet and turn in by **April 12!** ←
- Students interested in Athletics- physicals due byMay 17







**ALL** students must have the following shots in order to attend 7th grade:

- Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis)
- MCV4 Menactra (Meningitis)

Shot records MUST be received by the Junior High prior to the first day of school:

**August 14, 2024!** 

Schedules will NOT be released early to students until Shot records are updated.
